3. Of course the heart of the nativity story is giving,

4. Let us not confuse real love with the feelings.

5. Love is the sacrificing of the self for the benefit of another.

6. The purity of the story → the complete offering up of the self, yielding the self, to another.
7. God, in Christ, gave Himself to us without reservation. This is the core of the Christmas story. This is true love.
8. Yet there is something more than this that resonates with us.
9. The nativity story shows us a world in chaos, an oppressed world, an hopeless world. God enters into that hopelessness, not as a wrecking ball, but as a small, minuscule, insignificant, point of hope.
10. God here begins to reorder the cosmos through the birth of a baby.

11. Mary and Joseph and the Newborn Jesus are poor, cold, hungry, dirty, but because of their love for God and His love for them, for us, these things don't matter.

12. Love brings hope. In the Nativity, we see

- A) that the insignificant things are really the most significant.
- B) We see the cosmos reordered by God's love which shows us how we are to love.
- C) We see that our actions in the small things have cosmic consequences.
- D) And we comprehend in the story of Christmas, that there is a purpose to it all.
- E) The love of God revealed for us in Christ leads us to understand that we are headed for complete joy. This is our Eternal destiny.

13. The temptation for us is, that when we turn away from this season, when we turn back away from the manger and return to the "normal" 51 weeks of the year, that we forget the significance of every moment.

the love God shows us in this incomprehensible  
gift.

15. His gift of love gives us hope

16. His hope assures us that the struggles and pain  
we endure are not pointless. They will bring us  
to everlasting joy and unspeakable glory.

17. Therefore, let us resolve to embrace the Love,  
Hope, and Eternal Purpose of Christmas every  
day and moment of our lives

18. The Baby who was born for us grew to be the  
man who sacrificed Himself for us on the Cross.

19. Let us Honor God's gift to us, by always giving  
all that we are and all that we have back to God.
